Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



1 Ancient Taurine alias Nandi-Pada (c. 250 BC), Maurayan era, Malwa region. Gold, 0.11 g, a small Taurine also identified as a foot-print of a Bull (Nandi-Pada). Hand-made. Extremely Fine, Rare.

Estimate: ₹ 500-700



2 Shakya Mahajanapada (c. 600 BC), Punch-marked Coins, Silver, 6.49 g, 5 Shana, rectangular, Single Punch type. The main central punch consists of a Cross type symbol with a solid square at the center and dots around. Minute ancillary symbols around the main State symbol. The coin has two laminated flans wherein additional pieces of silver have been laminated over the surface of the coin to adjust the proper weight of the coin. Unifaced, blank reverse. Very Fine+, Not listed by Rajgor. Unpublished and Extremely Rare.

3 Shakya Mahajanapada (c. 600 BC), Punch-marked Coins, Silver, 6.75 g, 5 Shana, Square, Single Punch type. The central punch has a three-crescents symbol. Minute auxiliary symbols around. Lumbini Hoard type. Rajgor Series 33, Type 533. Very Fine+, Rare.

4 Kashi Mahajanapada (c. 525-465 BC), Silver, 3.86 g, Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, four-symbol type, with a Swastika-type pentagon symbol (Rajgor Series 58). Jakhania Hoard type. Combination of the four symbols is not listed earlier. Very Fine+, Rare.

5 Vanga Janapada (c. 550-400 BC), Billon, 2.52 g, Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, three-symbol type with a Boat representing maritime trade of Bengal, a Chakra and an armed symbol on obverse. Unifaced. Rajgor Series 4, Type but the third symbol of an armed motif is not reported. Very Fine+, Scarce.

6 Surashtra Janapada (c. 350-200 BC), Silver, 0.79 g, ¼ Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, Single-composite symbol type with a six-coned arches over a platform on obv. Unifaced, Junagadh Hoard 1985 type. This is a single-use coin of the Janapada, as most of these coins are restruck for a number of times. Hence to find a single-use coin like this is rare. Rajgor Series 18, Type 414a. Very Fine, Rare.

7 Magadha Empire (c. 400-300 BC), Silver, 3.09 g, Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, five-symbols type, six-armed symbol, sun, a hare, a dense tree and a fish symbols on obverse. A minute banker's mark on rev. Gupta & Hadaker, Series III, Type 307. Very Fine+, all five symbols are clear and distinct, Scarce.

8 Post-Maurayan Mathura (c. 200-150 BC), Silver, 3.28 g, Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, God Parshuram type; five-symbols on obverse and one symbol on reverse. Six-armed, sun, Standard-in-railing, tree-in-railing, Hindu God Parshuram standing with raised hands and holding a Plough, a Bull with Sun at the back symbol on obverse. A Sun symbol on reverse. Gupta & Hardaker Series Va, Type 497 and designated as VR. Extremely Fine, Very Rare.

9 Post-Maurayan Vidarbha (c. 200-150 BC), Silver, 3.21 g, Karshapana, Punch-marked Coins, five-symbols on obverse and two symbols on reverse. Six-armed, sun, Standard-in-railing, tree-in-railing, a composite symbol with a Swastika & a Taurine on obverse. A Damaru and a Triskali on reverse. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

10 Post-Maurayn Signet Ring (c. 250-100 BC), Conchshell (Shankha), 5.22 g, four Brahmi letters inscribed on the face of the Signet Ring, they read like Patahasa. Known from a Mauryan region dating back to about 250 to 100 BC. Unusual and reported very Rare.

11 Bhadra Dynasty of Vidarbha, Damabhadra (C. 200-150 BC), Copper, 2.41 g, Punch-marked type, five punches with a punch having Brahmi legend *Damabha*(*dasa*) = of Damabhadra. Ujjain symbol in center. Unifaced. Very Fine+, Scarce.

12 Agroha Dynasty of Punjab (c. 200-150 BC), Copper, 1.75 g, die-struck type with a. big tree in railing in the center, Brahmi legend on the right side a wavy river symbol on the right side of obverse. A big Swastika placed in the center of obverse. About Very Fine, Very Rare.

13 Erikachha City-State (c. 200-150 BC), Copper, 3.69 g, Punch-marked type, with four symbols on obverse and five symbols on reverse with an inscribed punch reading Erikachha. Very Fine+, Scarce.

14 Vidisha-Eran (c. 300-200 BC), Copper, 8.87 g, Punchmarked type, Four-symbols type with fishes and turtle in a river, a horse, an Ujjayini symbol and a tree in railing on obverse. Unifaced. Patinated, Very Fine, Scarce.

15 Vidisha-Eran (c. 300-200 BC), Copper, 3.36 g, Punchmarked type, Four-symbols type with fishes and turtle in a river, an elephant walking to left, a Standard in railing, and a Taurine in an enclosure on obverse. A single symbol of a Taurine on reverse. Patinated, Very Fine, Scarce.

16 Vidisha City-State (c. 250-200 BC), Copper, 7.86 g, retrograde Brahmi legend reading from right to left (Ve)disasa = Of Vidisha. A small tree in railing at the top. The whole execution is done in a big oval punch on obverse. Unifaced. With a small bend at one corner of the flan indicating from where the coin blank was cut from the sheet of metal. Uncirculated for the type, Extremely Rare in this high grade.

17 Tripuri City-State (c. 200-150 BC), Eastern Malwa, 6.98 g; Brahmi legend *Tipuri* in the first line; two symbols of a Hollow Cross and a Three-arched Hill with a Crescent at top placed in the second line on obverse. Blank reverse. Unifaced. Almost UNC, Extremely Rare in this high grade.

18 Kaushambi (c. 200-150 BC), Jethamitra, a deity standing in center, facing front, Brahmi legend on the right on obverse. A deity standing with a hand on waist, and a tree in railing on the right side on reverse. Unpublished, About Very Fine, Rare.

19 Kaushambi (c. 200-150 BC), Mitra rulers, Copper, 7.57 g, a tree in railing in the center with Brahmi legend below, a counter-mark of a Taurine in the left field on obverse. A bull standing to right facing a six-arched hill which is surmounted by a Taurine on reverse. Very Fine, Rare.

20 Mauryas (c. 250-200 BC), Copper, 2.53 g, Full Unit, Uninscribed Cast, with an elephant walking to left and a Swastika at the top on obverse. Three symbols on reverse, a tree in railing, a Stupa and a Hollow Cross. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

21 Mauryas (c. 250-200 BC), Copper, 1.07 g, Half Unit, Uninscribed Cast, with an elephant walking to left and a Swastika at the top on obverse. Three symbols on reverse, a tree in railing, a Stupa and a Hollow Cross. About Extremely Fine, Rare to find a Half denomination of the previous lot.

22 Indo-Greeks, Apollodotus II (c. 80-60 BC), Copper, 14.09 g, Full Unit, Greek God Apollo standing holding arrow to right, monogram to left & Greek legend around on obverse. Tripod of Apollo in the center, Kharoshthi legend on right, left and top reads, Maharajasa Tratrasa Apaladatasa. Very Fine+, Scarce.

23 Indo-Scythians, Azes (c. 58-30 BC), 12.49 g. Citygoddess seated frontally on a throne, holding cornucopia, Greek legend BASILEOS BASILEON MEGALOU AZOU around on obverse. Greek God Hermes standing, holding caduceus, monograms to either side; Kharoshthi legend Maharajasa Rajarajasa Mahatasa Ayasa around on reverse. ISCH 101.1. Very fine, Scarce.

24 Satavahanas, Gautamiputra Satarkarni era (c. AD 100-150), Lead, 4.09 g, Junnar Lion type with a majestic lion standing to left on obverse. An Ujjain symbol in the center with traces of Brahmi legend around on reverse. Very Fine, Scarce.

25 Satavahanas (c. AD 50-100), Anonymous, Lead, 3.42 g, Nashik Lion type, with a baby lion standing to right with a Swastika at its back on obverse. A tree in railing on reverse. Very Fine, Scarce.

26 Satavahanas (c. AD 50-100), Anonymous, Copper, 1.11 g, Vidarbha type, with a Swastika punched in the center of an earlier type on obverse. A tree in railing on reverse. Very Fine, Scarce.

27 Post- Satavahana Central India, Copper, 3.86 g, Gautamiputra Vishakhadatta (AD 150-200), a Nandipada enclosed in a rectangle in the center, flanked by a standard/sword to the right, Brahmi legend (Rajño Gotami) putasa Shri Vi (shakhadattasa) around. Unifaced. Unpublished only one coin of this ruler is known with full name. Very Fine+, Rare.

It is not known to which dynasty the king Gautamiputra Vishakhadatta belonged but it is certain that he must have risen to power in the aftermath of the Satavahana power being gradually eliminated from Vidarbha and the regions of Central India immediately to the North. A power struggle appears to have erupted here with the Maghas, the Nagas and the Vakatakas contesting for supremacy.

28 Anandas of Karwar, Mulananda (c. 100 BC), Lead, 16.49 g, a basket type eight-arched hill in the center, with Brahmi legend around, Rajno Mulanandasa (of Mulananda) on obverse. A tree in railing in the center with a Swastika on bottom-left, and other minor symbols on reverse. Patinated, uncleaned, About Extremely Fine for this broad flan coin, Scarce.

29 Anandas of Karwar, Anonymous (c. 100 BC), Lead, 0.80 g, smallest unit of this series, with six-arched hill in the center and a river represented by a wavy line beneath it on obverse. A Shrivatsa, the symbol of Goddess Lakshmi on reverse. Unlisted, About Extremely Fine, Rare.

30 Lesser Satavahanas of Banavasi, Chutukulananda Satakarni (c. 250-300 AD), Lead, 10.74g. A ten-arched hill in centre; Brahmi legend reads Raño Vinhukada Chutukulananda Satakanisa clockwise from 3 o'clock on obverse. A Tree-in-railing; strung bow and arrow to right on reverse. Not listed in MCSI. Very Fine+, Rare

31 Hiranyaka dynasty of South Central Karnataka / Andhra Pradesh (c AD 300-350), Lead, 10.21 g, Uninscribed 'horse' type . An Ashvamedha-Horse facing right, Shrivatsa symbol above, a pellet in front on obverse. A Six-arched hill with pellets in arches and a tree-inrailing, with wavy line below. MIGIS-9 type 1396. Very Fine, Scarce.

32 Kushana Empire, Kanishka I (c. AD 127-152), Copper, 16.72 g. Nimbate bearded King standing in the left profile, wearing a tunic and heavy boots; holding spear, sacrificing at an altar; Bactrian legend ShAO KA/NEShKI on either side, on obverse. Lunar deity Mao (Moon) standing to left, holding out right hand in blessing, and the left hand placed on waist; Bactrian legend, MAO on right, and Tamgha in left field. Goebl 774, MACW 3079. Beautifully toned with green patina, Extremely Fine for the type, Very Rare in such high grade.

33 Kushana Empire, Kanishka I (c. AD 150-250), Terracotta, 4.30 g, diameter of 24.40 mm, 6 mm thick. Ancient Replica of Gold Dinar, with the complete die impression of the obverse having the king standing to left and full Kushano-Greeko legend around. Found in Haryana in 1990s. About Mint State, Very Rare to find such a complete piece of ancient forgery.

34 Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana (c. AD 25-75), Silver, 2.11 g, Karshapana, Portrait type with Greek legend around the bust of the ruler on obverse, Thunderbolt with an arrow and legends in Brahmi and Kharoshthi on reverse. Very Fine, Scarce.

35 Western Kshatrapas, Chastana (c. AD 78-100), Copper, 1.23 g, Horse type, a horse standing to right with Greek legend around on obverse. Three arched hill with crescent and Brahmi legend starting with Rajnow Mahaksha...chastanasa on reverse. Very Fine for the type, Rare.

36 Western Kshatrapas, Ishvaradatta (c. AD 250), Silver, 2.16 g, Karshapana, Portrait type with Greek legend around and a numeral 1 for the First year behind the bust of the ruler on obverse. Brahmi legend with the name of the ruler as Mahakshatrapa and the year of issue as Varshe Prathame (the 1st Year). Very Fine, Rare with the numeral 1 on obverse.

37 Western Kshatrapas, Vijayasena (c. AD 248-185), Silver, 2.13 g, Karshapana, Year 174, Lakhi – Brokage of obverse, with the year of issue readable behind the bust as 174 (= AD 252). Portrait type with Greek legend around on obverse. Lakhi or incused impression of the obverse bust on reverse. Very Fine, Rare to find a Lakhi with full year of issue.

38 Western Kshatrapas, Rudrasimha III (c. AD 388-410), Silver, 1.90 g, Karshapana, Portrait type with Greek legend around and year numerals Vashe 3xx behind the bust of the ruler on obverse. Brahmi legend with the name of ruler and his father as Mahakshatrapa on reverse. Very Fine and Rare to find complete Brahmi word Varshe before the year of issue on obverse.

39 Gupta Empire, Chandragupta I (c. AD 319-343), Gold, 7.69 g, Dinar, "Archer & Goddess on Throne" type. King nimbate, standing left, holding bow by the top, in left hand and with the left hand holding bow at top, Chandra in Brahmi below arm, Garudadhvaja to left on obverse. Goddess Ardoksho seated facing front, on a fourlegged throne, holding Cornucopia in left hand, She is scattering gold coins with her out-stretched right hand. Royal Tamgha in the top-left field; label in Brahmi legend 'Shri Vikramah' in the right field (Sanjeev Kumar, TGE 2017, similar to Class I, variety D.2, page 160). On the plate specimens of Sanjeev Kumar, all of the illustrated coins have empty right hand of the Goddess without coins; however, on present coin, 3 coins are being scattered from the right hand of the Goddess. Very Fine+, not listed by Sanjeev Kumar, Extremely Rare.

40 Gupta Empire, Chandragupta II (c. AD 375-415), Gold, 7.62 g, Dinar, Chhatra type; Nimbate king standing facing left with his fist on the hilt of the sword he carries, offering in a Fire Altar on his right, a Dwarf has right leg bent up, is holding a Chhatra – parasol over the head of the king, on obverse. Nimbate Goddess Lakshmi standing on a lotus, facing front, and holding a diadem in right and a lotus stalk in left hand; Brahmi legend Vikramaditya (partly visible) to the right and tamgha to left. (Sanjeev Kumar, TGE 2017, Class I, Var. A.1, Page 252). Very Fine, Very Rare.

41 Gupta Empire, Chandragupta II (c. AD 375-415), Lead, 4.81 g, Garuda type with a Garuda seated, facing front on obverse. Brahmi legend Shri Vikrama on reverse. About Extremely Fine, Rare in this high grade.

42 Gupta Empire, Kumaragupta I (C. Ad 414-455), Silver, 2.06 g, Karshapana, Portrait type with the name of the ruler as Maku Gupta. Bust of the king to right with traces of Greek legend around on obverse. A Garuda standing in the center of the coin and Brahmi legend reads around, Parama Bhagavata Maharajadhiraj Shri Maku Gupta Mahendraditya. Earlier it was thought as this was a new ruler but palaeographically it is the degenerative type of the main coins of Kumaragupta of western India. Rajgor, Numismatic Digest. About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.

43 Gupta Empire, Kumaragupta I (C. Ad 414-455), Lead, 2.08 g, Garuda type, the divine bird Garuda is placed in a square and again within a dotted border on obverse. Brahmi legend Shri Kumara gupta arranged in a circular fashion around a central circle on reverse. Probably unpublished type, About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.

44 Gupta Empire, Skandagupta (C. AD 455-478), Silver, 1.90 g, Karshapana, Portrait type with the bust of the king to right on obverse. A Garuda standing in the center of the coin and Brahmi legend reads around, Parama Bhagavata Rajadhiraj Shri Skandagupta Kramaditya on reverse. Complete Brahmi legend on reverse makes this coin rare. Very Fine+, Rare.

45 Traikutakas, Dahrasena, son of Indradatta (c. AD 250-300), Silver, 1.62 g, Drachm, Bust of king facing right on obverse. A Three-arched hill, flanked by sun and moon, wavy line below; Brahmi legend Maharajedradatta putrasa Paramavaishnava Maharaja Dahrasenasa around on reverse. MAC 5080. Very Fine, Scarce.

46 Post-Guptas of Bengal, Samatata region, Balabhata of Khadga dynasty (c. AD 700-750), debased Gold, 5.67 g, Dinar. Stylised representation of 'archer' king holding bow and arrow in each hand, 'Nandi' standard in the backdrop; Brahmi letter Shri to the left of the head, and legend Bala / Bhata in two lines below the bow on obverse. Stylised representation of goddess, facing right making a gesture of reassurance, with curved lines (drapery?) behind her back; traces of crude inscription to right on reverse. ECB SAM17.2. Extremely Fine, Rare.

47 Vishnukundin dynasty of Vengi (c. AD 500-600), anonymous, alloyed Copper, 6.83 g, . A Lion facing to right with raised paw, sun and moon above and a Shrivatsa symbol in front on obverse. A Conch shell between two tridents within rayed circle on reverse. MCSI no.180. Very Fine+, Scarce.

49 Hoysalas (c. AD 12th century), Gold, 0.12 g, ¼ Fanam, a Lion roaring to right on obverse. Kannada letter Ba on reverse. Extremely Fine+, Scarce.

50 Hoyasala Feudatories of Malabar Coast (c. AD 1500-1600), Gold, 0.39 g, Veera Raya Fanam, a stylized Lion with a crescent design, known as Kaali on obverse. Stylized Boar with vertical line over its back on reverse. Extremely Fine, Scarce.

53 Vijayanagar Empire, Aravidu dynasty, Thirumalaraya (AD 1565-1578), Gold, 1.69 g, ½ pagoda, Lord Rama and Sita seated with Lakshman standing as an attendant on obverse. Nagari legend sri ti/rumala/raya on reverse. MCSI-I 805 - 806. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.
