Bidder acknowledges and agrees that the Auctioneer may not be required to pay a Buyer's Premium, or other charges that other Bidders may be required to pay and may have access to information concerning the lots that is not otherwise available to the public. Any claimed conflict of interest or claimed competitive advantage resulting there from is expressly waived by all participants in the Auction. The Buyer is the Bidder who makes the highest bid accepted by the Auctioneer, and includes the principal of any Bidder acting as an agent. In the event of any dispute regarding the Bidders, the Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute or may re-sell the disputed lot.
- 2) The Rajgor's Auctions reserve the right to postpone or cancel the auction without notice in its sole discretion. 1 **The Swastika Coin, Parat Rajas of Baluchistan,** Koziya (c. AD 235-265), Copper, 1.84 gr, Drachma, Parthian-style crowned bust of the ruler to left with moustache and beaded border around on obverse, a bold Swastika symbol in the centre, Kharoshthi legend around, *Koziyasa Kozanaputrasa Parataraja* on reverse. Issue of his Mid-Reign (Tandon# 54).

Pankaj Tandon has done an extensive research on this little-known coins and brought to light a number of rajas, types and varieties. Refer his article, The Coins of the Paratarajas: A Synthesis, in the *Supplement to ONS Journal* 205, 2010, London.

5 **Kunindas, Amoghbhuti** (1st century BC), Silver, 2.23 g, **Dramma**, Goddess Lakshmi and a deer in the centre and Brahmi legend around on obv, Hill, Standard and a Swastika in the centre and Kharoshthi legend on rev. The coin has a rare variety wherein the Goddess Lakshmi is standing and holding a lotus (*Padma*) by its long stem and holding it like modern-day balloon over her head. *Almost UNC*, *Rare*.

Kushanas, Kanishka I, Copper, 3.76 g, Urdhva Linga Shiva type, the king standing to left with offering in the Fire Altar near his right leg and legend around on obverse. Lord Shiva standing with a single head and holding a trident in his right hand, his left hand is hanging by the waist and Greeko legend in the right field reading OSHO. Almost Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare.

The most outstanding part of the coin is the reverse with the Lord Shiva standing and having an **Urdhva Linga** (erect phallus called **Ithyphallic Shiva**), the pose is quite distinct with his out of proportion Linga shown in a more realistic pose than the unrealistic pose of the same on his gold coins. The out of proportion of the Linga is purposely made to show this characteristic feature of Lord Shiva on such a small coin which could have easily been missed by its holder. It seems that this pose of Shiva is the earliest form which was developed later into a more subtle form of Shiva Linga. A similar coin is recorded by Joe Cribb in the British Museum, London. Another coin of the same type was recently sold by the Rajgor's for Rs. 27,000. An unusual coin with a very high implication on the religious history of India.

The Great Gupta Empire, Samudragupta (AD 335-380), Gold, 7.54 gr, Dinar, King and Queen type, issued in memory of his parents, King Chandragupta I and the Lichhavi Queen Kumaradevi. The king is shown offering a flower to the Queen with his right hand and a crescent (for Chandra) above which is rarely seen on these coins, with legend Kumaradevi in the left field and Chandra in the right field on obverse; Goddess Durga seated on a lion that is facing left, she is holding a cornucopia (Akshaya Patra) and a pasha (rope for binding) and legend Lichhavyah in the right field, to commemorate the marriage alliance of Chandragupta I with the Queen's Lichhavai family of Nepal (BMC pl. III-1, Altekar pl. I-12). Extremely Fine+, Great Rarity. The present coin shows the seated lion facing left while out of 7 such King & Queen coins auctioned in last one decade, only 1 such coin was of this variety. This explains the rarity of this type.

The Great Gupta Empire, Kumaragupta I (AD 385-455), Gold, 8.03 gr, Dinar, Lion-Trampler type, the king standing to right and is shown right wearing arm bracelets and waist cloth with sash floating behind his waist, he is drawing a bow in right hand and is aiming the arrow to the lion, trampling the lion with his left leg and the poor lion falls back in the right field near the edge, circular Brahmi legend around Sakshadiva (Narasimhah Simhamahendro Jayatyanisam) on obverse, Goddess Durga (Amba) is shown seated on a lion who is facing left, the Goddess is half-crossed legged with the right leg hanging down in front of lion, she is holding a Pasha in her right hand and the right hand is positioned at the waist and holding a long stalk of a lotus, the Brahmi legend in the right field reads, Simhamahendrasa. About Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare.

11 **Kushanas, Vasudeva II**, Gold, 7.84 gr, **Dinar**, king performing *Yagna* en olov and Lord Shiva and his vehicle Nandi on rev with the name in the right field, OSHO on reverse. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

AD), Gold, 5.78 gr, **Dinar**, **Lord Rama** standing to left and holding bow in his left hand and an arrow in the right hand and looking at the arrow. Behind him is a standard looking like a *Shankha-Danda*, a staff headed by a conch shell, a symbol o Vishnu and whose incarnation Lord Rama is. A single Brahmi letter, *Ja* in a cursive form below the left elbow on obv; Goddess Mohini, the female incarnation of Lord Vishnu is shown holding a vase (**Amrita Kumbha** or Vase of Eternity with Nectar) in her hands and looking at the vase. A decorated vase with a conch shell (**Shankha**) at top in the left field; and in the right field of the Goddess is a corrupt Brahmi legend.

The depiction of Mohini and her Vase was variously debated by scholars as Goddess Lakshmi or some obscure deity or even Goddess Paravati holding baby Ganesha, but the clear depiction of a vase and the Vaishnavite symbols help identify the real identification of the Goddess. Interestingly, this is the earliest and only example of the iconography of Mohini. Lord Vishnu in the female form of a beautiful nymph, Mohini has been the centre of the Puranic story of war between the Devas and the Danavas (Gods and Demons). After finding the Amrita Kumbha from the churning of ocean, dispute arose between the two in dividing of the nectar. The Gods were against giving the nectar to the Demons because by this the demons will be eternal and will continue the trouble against the gods. So Vishnu took a form of beautiful woman and by her beauty lured the demons and started serving the nectar to the Gods. However, two demons, Rahu and Ketu sensed something wrong and sat in the rows of the gods and drank a few drops of the nectar. Vishnu realized the situation, and before the nectar could pass through their mouth, he cut heads of the two demons with his Sudarshan Chakra. Since the nectar was in the mouths of the demons, their heads remained eternal live but their bodies were dead. Since then these demons, Rahu and Ketu are placed in the Hindu astrology as two planets whose job is to harass the humans. This story is enlivened on this coin where we find the only depiction of Mohini in human form. However, the form of Mohini as a beautiful woman was recreated by nearly 1300 years later in western India by the famous painter Raja Ravi Varma who painted her as a traditional Hindu lady wearing a saree in a natural backdrop.

Pedigree Auction of Ex-Pridmore Collection of East India Company Proof Coins

The base part of this unique and highly important Pedigree collection was formed by Major F. Pridmore, the author of the Bible on coins of British India called, *The Coins of the British Commonwealth of Nations to the End of the Reign of George VI 1952*; published in 1975 by the Spink & Son at London.

After his demise, his collection was sold in auctions in 1980s, and from there the present collection was formed by a senior numismatist in Bombay in 1980s and 1990s. He passed on this collection to another serious collector who in turn sold it to a gentleman in Mumbai in early 2010s.

The present collection of Proofs coins of the three Presidencies of the East India Company thus has four Pedigrees of serious collectors, right from Major Pridmore.

This collection consists of 36 coins in total and include Gold Gilt and Copper Proofs of the Bengal Presidency, Bombay Presidency and the Madras Presidency of the East India Company from 1791 to 1833. The collection includes many Unpublished and Unique Proof coins, and many more that are being auctioned here for the first time in India.


