- 1 **Swastika Coin, Gwalior State, Jayaji Rao, Copper, 6.1 g, Paisa**, a bold Swastika with dots in each segment on obv, Nagari initial of the ruler, *Ji* on rev. Not listed, *Very Fine, Scarce*.

- 2 **Swastika Coin, Magha dynasty of Kaushambi (2nd century BC)**, Copper, 0.38 g, Die-struck, northern India, a bold Swastika in the centre filling the entire flan on obv, an indistinct mark on rev. *Green patinated, Very Fine+, Rare*.

- 3 **Swastika Coin, Magha dynasty of Kaushambi (2nd century BC)**, Copper, 2.17 g, a prominent Swastika symbol placed in a beaded border on obv, a tree in railing with parts of Brahmi legend below on rev. *Very Fine+, Rare*.

- 4 **Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada (5th century BC)**, Silver, 0.9 g, ¼ **Karshapana, Shrivatsa type** with a bold central Shrivatsa in the centre and ancillary symbols around on obv, traces of earlier type on rev. *Green patina, Very Fine, Scarce*.

- 5 **Punch-marked coins, Surashtra Janapada (5th century BC)**, Silver (2), ¼ **Karshapana, Open Cross type**, an Open Cross in the centre with a Taurine inside and with ancillary symbols including a triskeli and a Swastika above. *Both the coins are of Restruck type with the reverse showing the earlier type. Very Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*

- 6 **Punch-marked coins, Surashtra Janapada (5th century BC)**, Silver (2), ¼ **Karshapana, Elephant type**, a walking elephant to right with ancillary symbols including a triskeli and a Swastika above. *Both the coins are of Restruck type with the reverse showing the earlier type. Very Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*

- 7 **Punch-marked Coins, Mauryas, 2nd century BC**, Silver (3), **Karshapana, 5 symbols type**, Series V and VI. *Very Fine. Scarce. 3 coins*

- 9 **Punch-marked coins, Post-Mauryas, 1st century BC**, Silver, **Karshapana, 5+1 symbols type** with the three Humans representing the Ramayana Trinity of Ram-Lakshman and Sita on obv. The sixth punch on rev. *Extremely Fine+, Scarce*.

- 10 **Erach (ancient Jhansi), 2nd century BC, Ajitaghosh**, Lead 8.35 g, Brahmi legend *ajitasa* on obv., an animal with double heads placed on two sides of its body on rev. The double headed animal is distinctly similar to the Mathura Lion Capital on the Mathura Reliquary found at Mathura. *Very Fine+ for the type, Very Rare*.

For more details on the animal, refer Harry Falk, Ten Thoughts on the Mathura Lion Capital Reliquary, in the *Felicitas*, published by Reesha Books International, 2011.

11 **Sakas of Ujjain**, 2nd century BC, Copper, 1.98 g, a **Roman head** to right on obv, a horse galloping to right on rev, uniscribed. The coin type is normally referred to as Mandasore Portrait as such coins were first encountered at Mandasore in Madhya Pradesh. *Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 4,000-5,000



12 **Kuras of Karwar**, 1st century BC, **Die of a Lead coin**, weighing more than 300 grams, depicting the usual Brahmi legend around a central motif of obverse type. 52 x 42 x 26 mm in height. Unusually big and heavy. It is for the first time that a die of such a small monarchs of Maharashtra is found. *Very Fine+, Extremely Rare.*

13 **Indo-Scythians, Azes**, Copper, **Tetradrachm**, king seated on a throne on obv with Greek legend around; standing Greek God to left in the centre and Kharoshthi legend around on rev. *Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

14 **Pandyas, Sunder Pandya**, 2nd century BC, Copper, a figure of Shiva seated and facing front with the ancient Tamil legend in the right field, *Sundara Pandian* on obv, an emblem of two fishes on rev. *Very Fine for the type and rare with legend.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,200



15 **Malayman Chiefs of Tamil Nadu**, Sangam Age, 1st century BC, Copper, 3.04 g, a horse standing to right and a Shrivatsa symbol on its back on obv, an ancient Map of the capital of the Malayaman Chiefs with three mountains on the top, and a river flowing from the mountains at centre on rev. *Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 3,000-4,000

16 Malayman Chiefs of Tamil Nadu, **Sangam Age**, 1st century BC, Copper, a horse standing to right on obv, a decorated conch shell on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

17 **Satavahanas, Kochhiputra Satakarni**, Copper, 1.94 g, a bull standing to right with Brahmi legend around on obv, a tree in railing on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce in this condition.*

18 **Satavahanas**, 2nd century BC, Lead, 1.36 g, a spoke wheel on obv, an Ujjayini symbol with a crescent on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500

19 **Satavahanas**, 2nd century BC, Copper, 1.09 g, a spoked wheel on obv, an Ujjayini symbol with a crescent on rev. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

20 **Kushanas, Kanishka**, 1st century AD, Copper, ¼ unit, king standing to left and offering Havi to a Fire Altar (Agni Kunda or Havana) on obv, Hindu God Lord Shiva standing in the centre and a label that reads in the right field, **OESHO**, i.e. Shiva. *Very Fine for the type, Scarce.*

- 21 **Western Kshatrapas, Chashtana** (1st century AD), Silver, **Karshapana**, portrait type, three arched hill and Brahmi and Kharoshthi legends on rev. *About Very Fine, Rare.*

- 22 **Traikutakas, Dhrahasena**, Silver, **Drachm**, portrait type, portrait of the ruler to right on obv, Brahmi legend citing name and title of the ruler around a three arched hill on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce.*

- 23 **Gupta Empire, Ramagupta**, Copper, 0.17 g, a seated Garuda with wings spread on obv, Brahmi letters **Ramagu..** for *Ramagupta* on rev. *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

- 24 **Gupta Empire, Kumaragupta I** (414-455), Copper, 0.12 g, a seated Garuda with wings spread on obv, Brahmi letter **Ku** for *Kumaragupta* on rev. *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

- 25 **Sharva Bhattarakas** (5th century BC), Lead, 6.15 g, a seated bull to left and beaded border around on obv, a Trident placed vertically on the left of a three-arched Hill in the centre of the coin with a wavy line for river and sun and moon symbols above, and everything placed inside a beaded border on rev. *Very Fine+, Unpublished, Rare.*

- 26 **Post-Kalachuris, probably Vakatakas**, 7th century AD, Copper, 2.07 g, a bull seated to right on obv with a crescent over its back, probably representing the Divine Vehicle Nandi of Lord Shiva, a Double Trishul, two sets of a three prongs of a trident placed side by side with minute symbols around on rev. *Extremely Fine, Unpublished, Rare.*

- 27 **Vardhanas, Shiladitya Harshavardhana** (606-647), Silver, Drachm, 2.39 a bust of the king facing left with crescent above and a symbol in front of his eyes on obv; A Garuda with wings spread in the center and ruler's name and titles around in Brahmi. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

- 28 **Vishnukundin**, 7th century AD, Copper, 6.66 g, a conch shell enclosed in a radiating sun symbol on obv, a roaring lion to right in a circle on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

- 29 **Gangas**, 11th century, Gold (2), 0.10 and 0.010 g, ¼ **Fanam** and 1/32 **Fanam**, the first has the usual Elephant to right on obv, and a scroll on rev. The second coin is interesting as it's the smallest one and has an indistinct line symbol on obv and an incused reverse. *Both are Extremely Fine, Rare. 2 coins*

- 30 **Gangas**, Gold, 0.40 g, **Fanam**, an elephant to right with a Royal *Chhatra* (Umbrella) above its back on obv, a scroll on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

- 31 **Southern India, Karnataka region**, Gold, 0.39 g, **Fanam**, Vira Raya type obv but elongated motif on obv, crude tiger motif on rev. *Unknown variety. Extremely Fine, Rare.*

32 **Gahadavalas of Kanauj** (1114-1154), **Govinda Chandradeva**, Gold, 4.29 g, Goddess Lakshmi seated facing front; Nagari legend on rev, reading *Srimad Govindchandra Deva* (Deyell# 145). About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

33 **Shilaharas of Maharashtra**, Gold, 0.80 g, **Double Fanam**, an ornate Trishul (trident) on obv, a solid globule on rev. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

34 **Shilaharas of Maharashtra**, Gold, 0.10 g, $\frac{1}{4}$ **Fanam**, an elephant walking to right on obv, a Kannada *Shri*-type symbol on rev. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

35 **Chalukyas of Kalyan, Someshwara IV Chalukya** (1181-1184), Gold, 3.40 g, **Pagoda**, Garuda with a prominent beak flying to right on obv. The form of Garuda on this coin is different from those of the Vijayanagara coins of Bukka Raya and Hari Hara as here Garuda / Hanuman is not holding a sword at his waist. The reverse reads in Kannada, **Dasapa Murari Shri Raja** (the King who scattered Murari). The legend refers to the King (Shri Raja) who destroyed the Kalachuris and restored the Chalukyas, namely Someshwara Chalukya himself, the issuer of this coin (Mitch# 282). Extremely Fine+, Very Rare.

36 **Vijayanagara Empire, Shri Ranga Raya** (1572-1586), Copper, **Kasu**, Gandabheranda on obv, Kannada Sri Ranga raya on rev (Ganesha# 14.3). *About Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

37 **Vijayanagara Empire, Pratapa Deva Raya** (1406-1422), Copper, **Kasu**, a bull standing to right and wearing a bell in its neck on obv, a dagger and shield with Kannada inscription on rev. *Probably unlisted. Extremely Fine and Rare.*

38 **Vijayanagara Empire, Hari Hara I** (1336-1354), Copper, 7.53 g, Lord Vishnu seated facing front, and cross legged; two line Nagari legend *Hari / Hara* on rev (Giri# 20). *Very Fine+ for the type, Rare.*

39 **Vijayanagara Empire, Hari Hara I**, Copper, Lord Hanuman moving to right with uplift tail surrounded by circular border of dots on obv, traces of Nagari legend on rev (Giri# 19). *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

40 **Vijayanagara Empire, Achyutaraya**, Gold, 1.66 g, $\frac{1}{2}$ **Pagoda**, Gandabheranda type with the mythical bird called Gandabheranda carrying two elephants in its two beaks and one each elephant in its legs on obv, Nagari legend on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce.*

41 **Vijayanagara Empire, Krishna Deva Raya** (1509-1530), Copper, a winged Garuda seated left with hands folded near chest on obv, a lion walking to right with a curled tail on rev. Not listed by Girijapathy. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

42 **Vijayanagara Empire, Copper (2)**, a jumping lion to left with upraised tail on obv, crude legend on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*

47 Vijayanagara Empire, **Hari Hara II**, Gold, 1.78 g, ½ Pagoda, Lakshmi-Narayana type with Goddess Lakshmi seated on the left thigh of Lord Vishnu on obv, and Nagari legend *Shri Pra / tapa Hari / hara* on rev. *Extremely Fine, Scarce in this condition.*

48 **Sethupatis, Sadaka Deva II** (1635-1641), Copper, **Kasu**, Lord Kartikeya seated on his vehicle Peacock on obv, Tamil legend, *sethupathi* on rev. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

49 **Banas of Madurai**, Copper, **Kasu**, a Garuda flying to left with both the hands hold upright and holding a snake in his right hand, Vishnu symbols Shankha and a Chakra on either side of his head, representing Lord Vishnu on obv, Tamil legend *Samara Kola Kalan* on rev. *Broad flan, Very Fine+, Scarce.*

- 54 **Mahmud of Gazanavi** (AD 998-1030), Silver, 2.59 g, **Sanskrit Dirham, Mahmudpur** (Lahore) Mint, AH 418, Kalima and titles on obv, Sanskrit legend in early Nagari script translates Arabic Kalima as *Avyaktamekam Muhammada Avtaranripati Mahamudasya*, it means, "Allah as One and Invisible and Prophet Muhammad is Incarnation of Allah", with complete marginal legend on rev (Rajgor# 1901; Deyell 66). *Very Fine, Rare.*

A similar lot in the Rajgor's Auction 9, lot 24 was sold for Rs. 16,000.

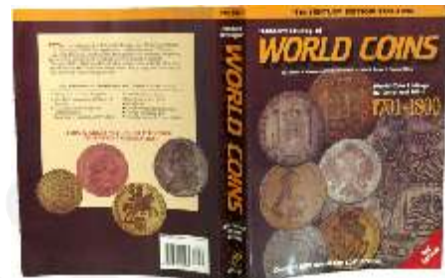

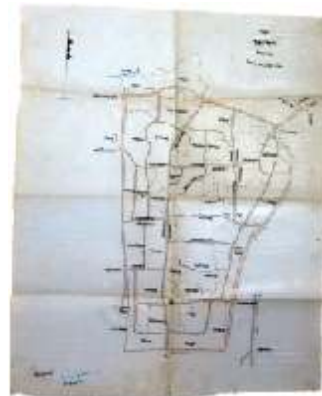

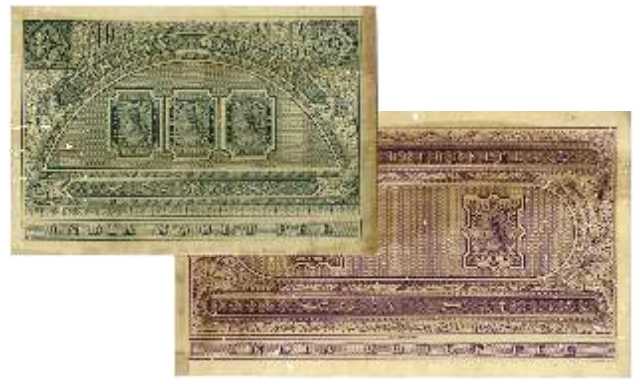

The reverse contains the Coat of Arms of the Island and the date 1997. The denomination at bottom reads “FIVE CROWNS”. The edge is grained. The Italian sculptor Lugi Bardia who designed the coin put his initial as LB on both sides of the coin. **Withdrawn from circulation and Rare.**

This was the first coin ever issued on her. Though she was the first living person to be featured on an Indian stamp (released by Indian Post on 27th August 1980), no coins were ever issued on her by any country till 1997. Turks and Caicos island made the coin more special by gilding it with gold - a first in its coinage history till then.

After the issuance of the coin, the authorities send a few coins to the office of the Missionaries of Charities (the order founded by Mother Teresa) for their appreciation. The sisters of the Charity opposed the issuance of the coin containing the effigy and signature of Mother Teresa on the grounds that she has strictly forbidden the use of her name for any commercial purposes. Since the Missionaries of Charity hold all the copy rights for Mother Teresa, the authorities and the mint had no option but to recall the coin and melt them.

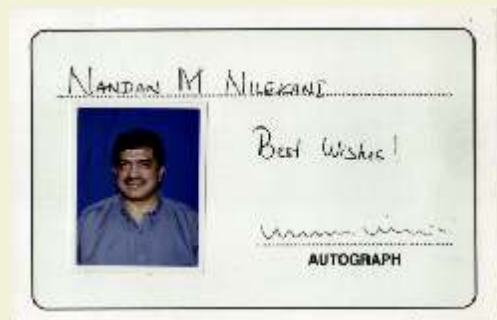

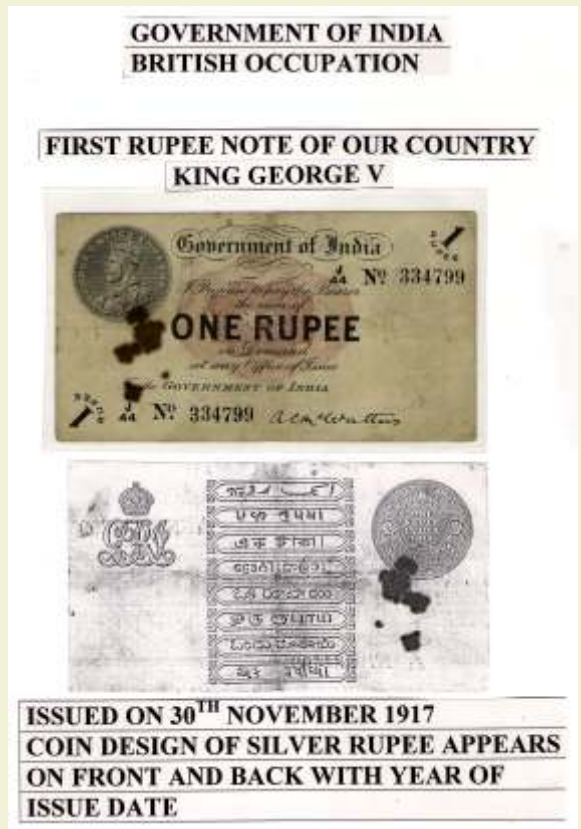

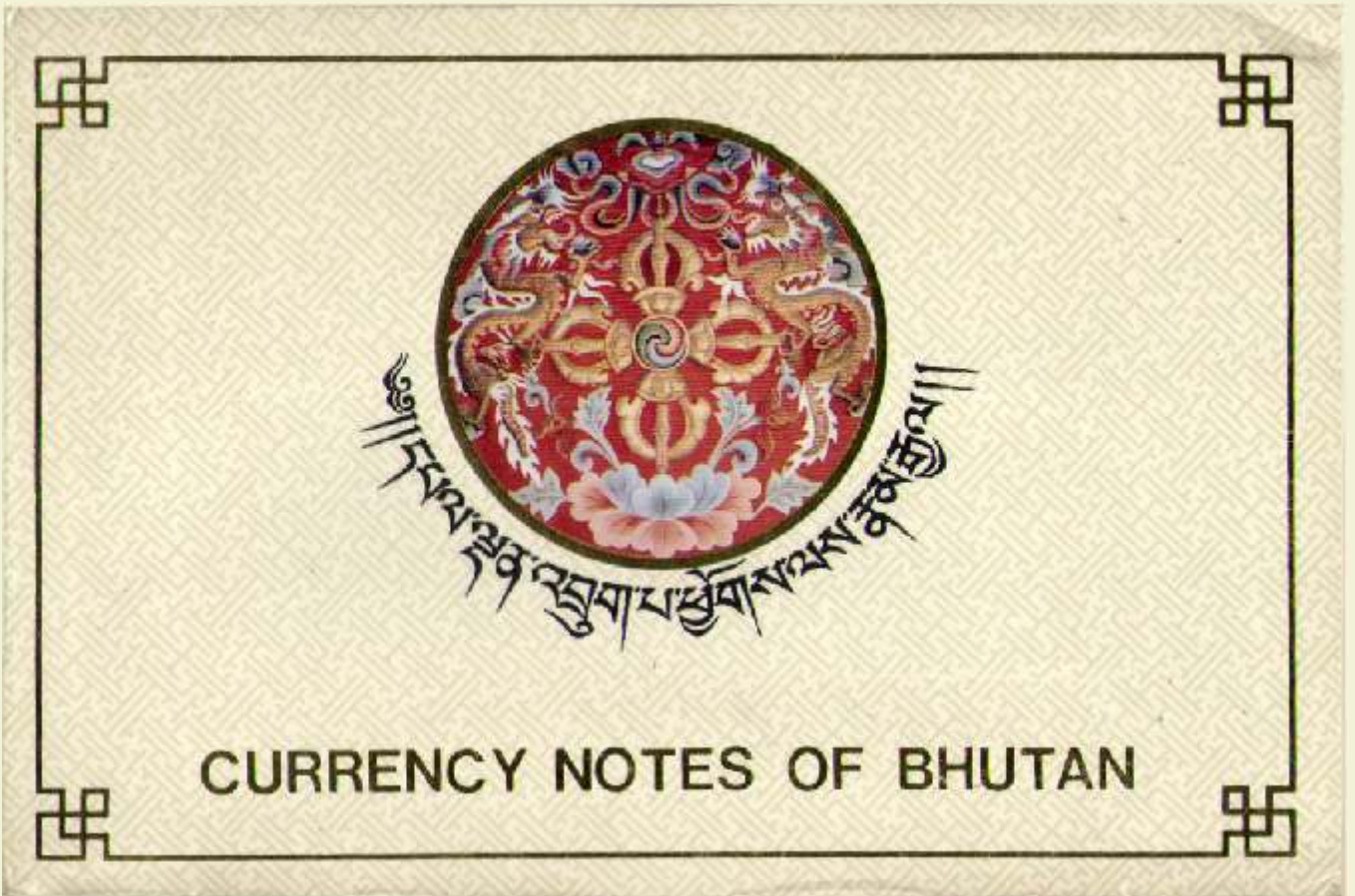
