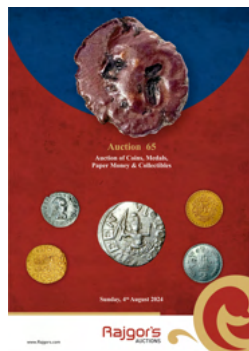

Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



- 1 **Pre-Historic Money, Early-Historic Age** (c. 1000-500 BC), Gold, 1.00 g, a set of four concentric circles placed in the shape of letter S, with a solid dot in the centre. A loop to hang around placed in the top-centre on reverse. Such kind of pieces of jewellery were used as money in the pre-coinage era in northern India. This particular money-piece was found in western India. Extremely Fine, Rare piece of history.

- 2 **Pre-Historic Money, Bronze Age Weapons** (c. 3000-1000 BC), miniature weapons from Gujarat-Saurashtra region, flint Arrow-Heads (3), three different weight standards, 1.58 g, 2.86 g, and 3.00 g. Such small arrows were mounted on wooden sticks and were used in hunting birds. Three different weights and shapes, About Extremely Fine, Very Rare as a set 3 different weapons.

- 3 **Pre-Mauryan Locket** (c. 300-250 BC), Copper, 15.53 g, square in shape with a loop at the top, Suarashtra-Gujarat region. Eight different animals moving around the flan with a horse, a fish and other unidentified animals on obverse. Unifaced. Very Fine for the type, unpublished and never seen like this one.

- 4 **Punch-marked coins, Surashtra Janapada** (c. 400-300 BC), Silver, 0.73 g, ¼ **Karshanapa**, a **squatting Lady or a Goddess** with the legs positioned in a Padmasana posture and both the hands are folded at the chest. Unifaced. Normal Surashtra Janapada coins are multi-struck with a coin having minted more than four times with different punched. However, this is a unifaced coin and having only one composite punch. Such kind of Punch-marked coins are very rare to find.

- 5 **Punch-marked Coins, Vanga Janapada** (c. 300-250 BC), Billon, 2.46 g, Heavy Series, three symbols type with a armed symbol, a Chakra Wheel and a Boat symbol on obverse. A Conch Shell Shankha on rev. Very Fine+, Rare.

- 6 **Punch-marked Coins, Vanga Janapada** (c. 300-250 BC), Billon, 2.46 g, Heavy Series, three symbols type with a armed symbol, a Chakra Wheel and a Boat symbol on obverse. A Conch Shell Shankha on rev. Very Fine+, Rare.

- 7 **Punch-marked Coins, Mauryas** (c. 300-200 BC), Silver, 3.38 g, Karshapana, 5+1 symbols type, with five different symbols, namely a Sun, a Six-armed symbol, a tree in railing, a pond with four fishes and four taurines around a central dot on obv. A small bull type animal on rev. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

8 Punch-marked Coins, **Mauryas** (c. 300-200 BC), Silver, 3.28 g, Karshapana, 5+1 symbols type, with five different symbols, namely a Sun, a Six-armed symbol, a tree in railing, a Bow and Arrow and a Caduceous on obv. A small three-arched hill with a crescent at top on rev. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

9 **Indo-Greeks, Menander I** (c. 160-145 BC), **Drachm**, Silver, 2.23 g, Bilingual series, obv. diademed and draped bust of the ruler to right, rev. Athena Alkidemos standing left, monograms to left and right (Mitch ACW 1770, Bop 13S). Very Fine+, Rare

10 Indo-Greeks, **Menander I** (c. 160-145 BC), **Drachm**, Silver, 2.26 g, Bilingual series, obv. diademed bust to left seen from behind, wearing aegis and brandishing a spear; rev. Athena Alkidemos advancing left, holding shield and thunderbolt; monogram to right (BopRahman 304). Fine+.

11 Indo-Greeks, **Menander I**, **Drachm**, Silver, 2.36 g, obv. helmeted bust of the king to right with Greek legend around, rev. Pallas standing left holding shield on raised right arm and hurling thunderbolt, with Kharoshti legend around, Control mark of Pushkalavati (Mitch ACW 1780). Extremely Fine, Rare.

Estimate: ₹ 4,000-5,000

12 Indo-Greeks, **Apollodotus II** (c. 110-80 BC), **Drachm**, Silver, 2.17 g, obv. diademed and draped bust of the ruler to right with Greek legend around; rev. Pallas holding shield, Tamgha in left field with complete Kharoshti legend around (Mitch ACW 2050-51). Very Fine, Rare.

13 Indo-Greeks, **Hippostratos Soter** (c. 65-55 BC), **Tetradrachm**, Silver, 9.07 g, obv. diademed and draped bust of the ruler to right, rev. Goddess standing facing, head to left, wearing kalathos, holding cornucopiae and raising hand in benediction, monogram to left, Kharoshti letter to right, Kharoshti script around (Bopearachchi 1A). Very Fine+, Extremely Rare.

Estimate: ₹ 50,000-60,000

14 Indo-Greeks, **Hermaeus with his wife Calliope** (c. 40 BC), **Drachm**, Silver, 1.83 g, obv. diademed busts of the king and queen with Greek legend around, rev. king mounted on a horse, prancing right around Kharoshti legend (Mitch ACW 2003). About Very Fine, Very Rare.

- 15 **Panchalas, Dhruvamitra** (c. 200 BC), Copper, 4.46 g, three symbols in the top line and brahmi legend Dhruvamitrassa in the bottom line in a square on obverse. A composite symbols with a standard having two posts and a motif in the centre on obv. About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000

- 16 **Panchalas, Jayamitra** (c. 200 BC), Copper, 4.16 g, three symbols in the top line and brahmi legend Jayamitrassa in the bottom line in a square on obverse. A composite symbols with a standard having two posts and a motif in the centre on obv. About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.

- 17 **Panchalas, Yajñabala** (c. 100 BC), Copper, 2.72 g, three symbols in the top line and brahmi legend Yajñabalassa in the bottom line in a square on obverse. A deity resembling Fire God Agni with Fire Flames over his head, standing in the centre of a standard having two posts on obv. Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.

- 18 **Chutus of Banavasi, Chutukulananda**, Lead, 5.02 g, obv. Six-arched hill in centre and around Brahmi legend, 'Rajno Chutukulanandasa'; rev. tree in railing. Very Fine for the type, Scarce.

- 19 **Chutus of Banavasi, Sivalananda**, Lead, 8.06 g, obv. eight-arched hill with Brahmi legend 'Rajno Sivalanandas' around; rev. tree in railing with ancillary symbols on either side (Mitch K&A 45). Very Fine+. Rare.

- 20 **Satavahanas, Punch-marked type**, probably **Kotalingla type**, Lead, 5.46 g, two punches on obverse having a galloping Horse to right and an Ujjain symbol; the third symbol is partly seen with a minute Shrivatsa symbol. A small incused punch on reverse. Very Fine, Rare.

- 21 **Satavahanas, Swastika Coin**, Copper, 3.63 g, c. 100-50 BC, an elephant waling to right with a Swastika placed in the bottom-right corner under the trunk of the elephant, Brahmi legend reads from IX: Rajno... A square and minor motifs inside on the reverse. Very Fine+, Rare.

- 22 **Banavasis** (c. 100 BC), Bell metal Copper (6), 0.24, 0.24, 0.23, 0.20, 0.15 and 0.14 g, Single symbol type with a bold symbol like a Padma Lotus or a conch shell and other symbols placed in the centre enclosed in a circle on obverse. Unifaced. About Extremely Fine, Scarce. (6)

23 **Kumaras of Karhad, King Kumara** (c. 60-80 AD), Lion to right type, Lead, 13.29 g, a maned lion standing to right on a platform and complete Brahmi legend reads around, *Kumarasa Isa Mulasa*. A tree in railing in the centre and three-arched hills on either side of the tree on reverse.

This is one of the earliest issues of Junnar in Maharashtra. On most of the coins, the lion is seen facing left, however, this is the first time the lion is shown standing to right.

About Extremely Fine and probably unpublished. Extremely Rare with full legend.

24 **Mahasenapatis of Maharashtra** (c. 100 BC), **Swastika Coin**, Copper, 2.72 g, an elephant standing to right with a big bold Swastika symbol over its back on obverse. A thunderbolt and an arrow placed within a dotted border on reverse. This is an important coin of the Satavahana period wherein the Thunderbolt and Arrow motifs of Kshatrapa King Nahapana were copied locally. These coins were minted after the defeat of Kshatrapa Nahapana at the hands of Gotamiputra Satakarni. Very Fine+, Rare.

25 **Kota Kulas of Haryana** (c. 300-400 AD), Copper, 4.57 g, Lord Shiva and Nandi standing on obverse. Brahmi letters Kota in the centre with a dotted border around on reverse. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.

26 **Western Kshatrapas, Kshaharatas, Nahapana** (c. AD 50-100), Silver, Portrait type, thr-lingual, with the portrait of the king to right and Greek legend reads behind his back NAAPNAA and also at top and in front of right on obverse. Thunderbolt and arrow in the centre with a solid dot discus in the centre of the reverse and Brahmi and Kharoshthi legends around the central motif. Extremely Fine, Rare.

28 **Gupta Empire, Chandragupta II** (c. AD 380-413), Copper, **Portrait type**, 1.72 g. The Bust of the ruler with long earrings to left on obverse. Divine Bird Garuda standing facing front in the top line and Brahmi legend *Chandragupta* below, dotted border around (Sanjeev Kumar, TGE, Bust Type, p. 280). About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.

- 29 **Yaudheyas** (c. 4th century AD), Terracotta, 5.20 g, **Mould** of Copper coins of the Yaudheyas, the reverse mould of the coin shows negative impressions of Goddess Devasena standing in the centre and facing right. Very thick and burnt marks because of heavy baking. Repaired. Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.

- 34 **Bracelet - Baju Bandh of Garuda**, c. late 17th century, Late Vijayanagara period, Copper, 58.76 g, divine bird Garuda (Eagle) flying in the centre with decorations around. With four loops in four corners to strings. Beautiful curvature measuring with the curvature of an upper arm. Garuda is a divine vehicle – Vaahana of Lord Vishnu. Such kind of depiction is usually found on the copper coins of Vijayanagar empire. Very well preserved, Extremely Rare.

- 35 **Paramaras of Malwa, Nara Varman** (AD 1094-1133), Copper, 4.03 g, Goddess Lakshmi seated and facing front on obverse. Devanagari legend in three lines reads, Shriman-an / ra vamma / deva on reverse (Deyell# 165). Such coins are generally found in base gold, however, these coins in copper are extremely Rare.

- 36 **Post-Vijayanagara**, Copper, 2.40 g, Kasu, a Duck like animal walking to left on obverse. Usual cross and lines design on reverse. Almost UNC, Rare.

- 37 **Post-Vijayanagara**, Copper, 3.21 g, Kasu, God Hanuman fighting to right on obverse. Usual cross with minute symbols within on reverse. Extremely Fine, Rare.

Dear Seibal Rose,

To start a work at Moti Jheel I had to find a nearby place to stay. Fortunately an organization by the name of 'Sisters of the Poor' readily provided shelter for me. Sisters of voluntary organization allowed me to stay there till I was able to make alternative arrangements for my stay. Next day I undertook house-to-house visits in the locality of Moti Jheel, to get acquainted with people of the area. I apprised the residents there of my intention to start a school in the locality. I wanted to impart proper education and discipline to the children who otherwise wandered aimlessly in the streets. One poor couple in Moti Jheel was the first to greet me. They promised to send their children to my school. Next day five children all in dirty clothes appeared before me. As the first step I washed their hands and face and also taught them how to greet others nicely. Every Sunday the school was closed. On that day I myself bathed the little children with soap and their clothes was also cleaned. These children had the habit of using vulgar, bad, foul and uncivilized words. I shall write to you in my next letter.
