Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



1 **Primitive Money**, Cowries (3), Copper, 19.83 g, 17.00 g, and 13.30 g (c. 4th century BC). **Cowries or Kodis** are the earliest natural objects used as a part of barter exchange. The use of cowries started even before 1000 BC but it remained in circulation in early historic period also. Since natural cowries were subject to wear and tear, such broken Cowries were not accepted as money in local markets. To overcome this difficulty, in early historic period around 600 BC, Cowries were made in metals, like copper. Such metal cowries had a long life and remained in circulation for hundreds of years. These three Copper Cowries were found along with Surashtra Janapada Punch-marked coins in Junagadh District of Gujarat. This association of Cowries along with Punch-marked coins indicate that the cowries remained at par with coined money in 4th century also. An important piece of historical linkage between coins and primitive money. Set of 3 Copper Cowries of three different weights.

2 **Primitive Money**, c. 3rd century BC, Mauryan India, **Necklace made of 50 Beads** of varying sizes from smallest to biggest, total weight of the necklace is 41 g. Haryana region and normally these beads are found along with copper uninscribed coins of Mauryan period. Such Beads and their necklace were often used as a medium in Barter Exchange between manufacturers of these beads and their high-end customers. Well preserved, and Very Rare.

3 **Primitive Money**, **Gold Grain Beads**, c. 3rd century BC, **Mauryan India**, Gold (4), each bead weighs 0.23 g, Golden Wheat Grains made as Beads for ornaments with exact copy of the organic grains. Found along with Mauryan Punch-marked silver coins in the Haryana region of northern India. Almost UNC and exceedingly Rare. (4)

Rev: king mounted on horse right, holding whip, tamgha in right field; crude Greek legend BASILEOS BASILEON COTER M around. Extremely Fine+ with patination, Rare.

- 40 Kushanas, **Huvishka**, Copper, 7.12 g, **MIORO type**, King seated with left leg bent and the right hanging, facing right and Greco-Bactrial legend around on obv. God Mioro Miro standing to left and lable MIORO in the right field. Very Fine+, Scarce.

- 41 **Yaudheyas** (c. 4th century AD), **Coin Mould of copper coins of the Yaudheyas**, Terracotta, 5.20 g, the front side shows usual obverse design of the Yaudheya coins with Lord Kartikeya standing with his *Vahana* Peacock and Brahmi legend around. Unifaced. Haryana region. Thick 5 mm and original minor burnt marks on the back side. Extremely Fine for the type, and Scarce.

Rev: **Swastika** facing right as a central figure, with Kharoshthi legend around: **Bhimarjunasa Yolatakhmaputrassa Pāratarājasa** (= coin of Parata Raja Bhimarjuna, the son of Yolatakhma). About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.



The Parata Rajas were a tribe who ruled in modern Baluchistan (in Pakistan) in 2nd and 3rd centuries AD. The central symbol on their coins is Hindu **Swastika**, mostly facing right and sometimes facing left, too.

The Parata Rajas originally hailed from Persia - Iran and settled in Baluchistan. Use of **Swastika** on their coins tracks back to their roots in Iran-Iraq and with the Persian God Mithra. In Zoroastrian Persia, **Swastika** was the divine symbol for the **Revolving Sun** (called *Garduneh-e-Khorshid*). **Swastika** was also associated with the divine Wheel (*Swastika*) of God Mithra, called *Garduneh-e-Mehr*, which represented fire, infinity, or continuing recreation. The Persian **God Mithra**, the mediator god of Zoroastrian Persia was the preserver of law and order and a god of war. This coin is also important because it is the last phase of Parata raja's silver coinage. From this issue onwards, all the Parata Raja coins were issued first in billon and then debased into copper. Another important historical fact about the king Bhimarjuna, is that he is the first Parata King to adopt a Hindu name, deviating from his ancestors who had Perso-Iranian names. The Hindu name *Bhimarjuna* is an amalgamation of two names from the *Mahabharata*, namely, Bhima and Arjuna !

Almost UNC with a broken corner, Very Rare.

Use of Kharoshthi legend on coins of reduced considerably on the coins of Chastana. On most of his coins, Kharoshthi legend either referred his first name or in later coins, it was represented by only a letter like Cha for Chastana. However, on this coin Kharoshthi legend has been placed on the obverse and has replaced Greek legend. The placement of Kharoshthi is quite rare and has not been seen earlier. It is a new type and a historical piece too.

- 51 Guptas, **Ramagupta**, Copper, 0.32 g, a stylized **Garuda** facing front on obv; Brahmi legend **Ramagupta** in the central line on rev. Very Fine+, Scarce.
